- The **EU Tracking Roadmap** is an annual publication which will be released each year from 2013 until 2015. It monitors the progress of renewable energy sources (RES) towards the 2020 target both at EU and Member State levels.
- The **European Overview of Deviations and Barriers Report** tracks on the one hand Member States' past progress in RES development by comparing actual RES deployment with planned deployment. On the other hand, it outlines the current situation regarding administrative, financial and technical barriers for the further development of RES in Member States.
- The **Policy Recommendations** report is an annual publication which will be released each year from 2013 until 2015. It offers detailed recommendations at EU and at Member State levels on how to keep on track with the indicative trajectory defined by the RES Directive.
- **Biannual National Policy Updates** are "policy briefings" and provide updates on the latest EU and national RES policy developments.

The Keep on track! project aims to provide market, legal and political advice and recommendations for EU Member States to stay on track with the indicative trajectory for renewable energy sources (RES) as set by the RES Directive.

Based on the experience gathered during the Intelligent Energy Europe project [REPAP2020](#), Keep on track! provides:

- a platform for discussion among different market actors such as renewable energy industry associations, national and EU Parliamentarians and the scientific community;
- a close-to-market monitoring of the fulfilment of the RES trajectory for each of the 27 EU Member States and for Croatia in 2015;
- early warnings and solutions on how to compensate any possible delay encountered, should a Member State be found to be lagging behind and failing to overcome identified barriers for RES deployment.

## A VIRTUAL LEGAL HELPDESK TO PROVIDE LEGAL SUPPORT

As part of the Keep on track! website a **Virtual Legal Helpdesk** is animated by project partner Becker Büttner Held (BBH).

The Virtual Legal Helpdesk assists **local, regional, national and European policy makers** as well as **national renewable energy associations** with the implementation of the RES Directive into national law.

The Virtual Legal Helpdesk will help to ensure a stable and solid legislative framework for the development of renewable energy in the EU Member States.

To that end, the Virtual Legal Helpdesk offers three different features:

1. A “Legal Advice Facility” where targeted stakeholders can ask the Legal Expert Team their legal questions that will be answered via an online form and on a confidential and individual basis.
2. A “Download documents” page, where information and guidance are provided to the wider public and which is also complemented by
3. “Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)”, published whenever the confidentiality clause ensured by the service is complied with.
